Greetings friends!

On June 27, 2017 CEO and founder of Facebook, Mark Zuckerberg announced to his global social network that "there are now 2 billion people connecting and building communities on Facebook every month!" 2 billon people; that's 4 billion...eyeballs...scrolling...Facebook! Are you one of the 2,000,000,000+ Facebook users? Or are your children or grandchildren part of this expanding global social media community?

Facebook is changing the way that people connect and find community. Mr. Zuckerberg also announced his company's research data: over 1 billion Facebook users are members of at least one or more of the myriad of Facebook groups. For instance, I participate in vocational development groups, community groups, parenting help groups, hobby enthusiast groups, or political awareness groups all via Facebook. Recently this year I have joined a couple private groups that were for online coaching for some leadership books I have been reading. The authors host weekly Facebook Live webcast videos where I can ask him or her questions and they will answer them in real time during their presentations. Even a few years ago, I would have never had that kind of opportunity without paying hefty fees for that. What about you? Are you or your kids or grandkids involved in any Facebook groups? Have you ever used Facebook Live to view or broadcast live video streams from your mobile device/smart phone? This is available to the masses.

Meanwhile, I read a sobering statistical analysis and a call to action from Dr. Thom Rainer, renowned church leadership speaker and CEO of LifeWay Christian Resources. Here's what his church research networks have observed using denominational statistics and in depth surveys across the nation: "Most churches in America have fewer than 100 attendees. but two out of three of these small churches are declining. The smaller the church, the more likely it is to be declining. A declining church with less than an attendance of 100 declines at a rate of 7.6% per year and ones with less than 50 declines at a rate of 8.7% per year." Moreover, the median age of clergy in the past 25 years has risen from 40 years old to 54 years old (and getting older), while the largest and fastest growing segment of the working population are the Millenials (born between approx.1980 and 1996). So it seems that the general population is growing younger but the church leadership is rapidly growing older. Especially in rural areas. Wow.

Another elephant in the room is the prevalence of more households who don't physically come to church most Sundays because they have A) family members working, or B) students with extracurricular activities scheduled on Sunday mornings, often with increased travel. Even retirees in America who have been faithful church attenders are spending less Sundays in worship because of their travel to visit their children and grandchildren, many of whom live farther from their hometowns than in previous years. Do you have family members who live far away or have you had to miss church services more than previous years because of an increase in travel, extra-curricular activities (sports!), work, etc.? I'm not writing this to guilt-trip any one. The societal norms are changing. EVERYONE is busier! This is a missional issue for us as the local church. How do we reach out to connect with our loved ones and neighbors who seem to be out of reach because of their rapid schedules?

Paul raised a similar missional issue in his time. There were large swaths of people in Rome who had not heard the Good News but as Gentiles had no interest in stepping foot in any of the local Jewish synagogues, even those with Jewish Christian converts.

So what did he say to challenge the Roman Christians to reach the Gentiles who were seeking to know God: *Romans 10:14* But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? 15 And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" Likewise, when faced with a changing world, Peter exhorted his fellow Christians to remember that people are always watching and they have ample opportunities for public witness to their hope in Christ's love: 1 Peter 3:14b Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, 15 but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; 16a yet do it with gentleness and reverence.

You see, 1st century messengers or heralds were sent from one place to another to bring a timely announcement of good news, from a battlefield victory to the imperial headquarters, or from one persecuted church in Asia Minor to the home base church in Jerusalem. Their feet suffered the rapid pace of travel and treacherous terrain in order to reach their intended audience. We have an untapped audience who is hungry for the gospel of Jesus Christ but can't always make it to church or is hesitant to return to or even step foot inside a church building. So how can we begin to bridge this intergenerational gap and find new ways to connect with our traveling and hurried family members, friends, and neighbors as a local church here in Alpha today? How can we make our feet beautiful with good news in new places?

Well, for one, we need to increase our digital and social media footprint. The "front doorstep" of the local church in 2017 is not so much physical as it is virtual. The two places that most people make first contact with a local church today is: 1) via Google search (to the church website) and 2) via Facebook search (to the church Facebook page). This past month, our church started the process of revamping our website (www.alphaumc.org) for a clearer presentation on mobile devices. We also now have online giving via our website through the VANCO online payment portal. So even when our church family members are far away, people can still give generously toward the mission and disciple-making ministry of our local church to reach more people for Jesus. We also have started to pay more attention to our local church Facebook page and plan to send out more than just announcements, but encouraging scriptures and prayers to help equip and empower you during the weeks this fall. Thus, this fall, as Pastor I am taking an opportunity to "step out of the boat" in faith and trust God to help us connect more people with Christ by webcasting live video streams of my sermons and eventually our worship services on Facebook Live. This way people can comment or direct message the church either live or afterwards with prayer requests as needed and people can share our worship experience with their family, friends, and neighbors. We can reach out and connect people with hope in Jesus Christ who are homebound, hospitalized, deployed, traveling, at college, working, farming, etc. This is the social media form of church hospitality.

<u>I can't do this alone. I need your help</u>. I have faith that you will share the good news of Christ in many ways: through sharing testimony in your everyday lives, acts of compassionate mercy, healing prayers, and your personal invitations to attend church physically or to watch online via our church Facebook page: (www.facebook.com/alphaunitedmethodist/).

Christ transforms our lives so our community can thrive!


