Greetings brothers and sisters!

We are preparing for our 40-days stewardship campaign that will begin October 15th and will conclude on November 26th, Christ the King Sunday. We will also be journeying together in an "all-church" 40-days prayer/mission devotional called "The Intercessory Life" by Dr. Maxie Dunnam. This year's stewardship message is inspired by Acts 4:29-37 and our theme is "Signs and Wonders." For now, let's look at Acts 4:29-31, where Jesus' apostles faithfully pray for a mighty move of God for their ministry.



29 And now, Lord, look at their threats, and grant to your servants to speak your word with all boldness, 30 while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus."

31 When they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God with boldness.

The context in verse 29 is that the apostles of Jesus had been been arraigned in

Jerusalem's court for preaching the gospel of the crucified and resurrected Christ. They prayed a holy prayer of desperation and dependence on God to help them continue to share the gospel of Jesus in their everyday lives. First of all, they *faithfully pray.* 1) They *faithfully ask* God to give them the ability to speak His Word "with all boldness." 2) They faithfully expect God to stretch out His hand to heal people whom they pray and minister with. 3) They trust God to *faithfully respond* and perform "signs and wonders" as they proclaim the holy name of Jesus. Second, in verse 31, Luke writes not 'after' but "When they had prayed...the place in which they gathered was shaken"! So, not just the people praying are being transformed by God, but their physical location was impacted by their praying in Jesus' name. Third, their prayers were immediately answered by God as soon as they prayed together in that holy moment, because in the midst of their prayer "they were all filled with the Holy Spirit" (just like they were in Acts 2 on the Day of Pentecost) and "they spoke the word of God with boldness." So, God answered their precise prayers by the time they were finished praying because their prayers were empowered and emboldened in the Spirit as they prayed aloud the Word of God together. Finally, the picture above is from the 2018 New Room Conference I attended in Franklin, TN last month. It was a holy moment when the Holy Spirit transformed our plenary session into a revival prayer meeting. We were all filled with the Holy Spirit and in the picture you can see our meeting place was shaken! God, may we be refreshed by your Spirit again!

I am praying for you all, faithfully asking God to perform "signs and wonders" to 1) unify our church in the Holy Spirit, 2) for empowered testimony in Jesus' name, and 3) extravagant generosity in God's grace.



This study will be of the book *The Intercessory Life* by Maxie D. Dunnam. Books are \$13.55 each. The study includes a daily devotional and will meet Sunday mornings at 9:00am for 6 weeks.

Below is a description of the study:

Maxie Dunnam's six-week study challenges us to get beyond the cozy comforts of a devotional life and break into ways of living prayer that open new horizons of possibility. *The Intercessory Life:* A *Missional Model for Discipleship* is the pattern for our interior growth in prayer as well as the outward expression of a missional Christ-life in the world.



The Intercessory Life is about discipleship. To be sure, intercession is prayer, but prayer is only one expression of intercession, though much more. Intercession is the pattern for discipleship. Yes, right now. In your world. In your church. In your home. In a prison. In a school. On the bus. In the office. On the street. This book teaches practical ways to bring the world into the prayer closet and to unleash the power or prayer in our everyday world.

Through his patented way of teaching the Bible, Dunnam inspires faith with personal experience and contemporary witness, providing inspiring

and challenging models of persons living an intercessory life who are standing in the gap and taking light into dark places.

God can do a lot through those willing to take risks on the journey of faith. Maxie Dunnam gives us bold guidance in what may be his best work yet.

there is a need for these. This is a fun project for anyone! We invite anyone from the church or community to join us at 6:45 on Wednesday, November 1 at Alpha UMC.


Alpha UMC Annual Trunk or Treat

and tables will be available in the fellowship hall. Come join us!




The Nurture Team is collecting snack items for college boxes.
