Greetings friends,

Lent is upon us and Holy Week is the last week of March. I have been praying and asking God what truth he wants to speak into our lives this month, especially as we face the troubles and tragedies of our wounded and divided society in 2018. The Holy Spirit has directed my attention to Jesus' prayer for his disciples from John 17:1-26

17 1 After Jesus had spoken these words, he looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, 2 since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. 3 And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. 4 I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. 5 So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed.

6 "I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. 7 Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; 8 for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. 9 I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. 10 All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. 11 And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. 12 While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. 13 But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves.14 I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. 15 I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one.16 They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. 17 Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. 18 As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. 19 And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

20 "I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, 21 that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. 22 The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, 23 I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. 24 Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

25 "Righteous Father, the world does not know you, but I know you; and these know that you have sent me. 26 I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."



Now I can hear some of you now..... "What? Something else to add into my already overloaded schedule?". Well, here is my challenge to you - It's impossible to know someone if you don't spend time with them. Prayer is an opportunity to spend time with God. To really understand the heart of God, you need to pray. I have recently had the opportunity to study more about prayer and I too felt overwhelmed about what I was learning. So, I would like to put prayer into our regular practice on Sunday mornings. At 9:50 am, we will be joining together in the room off the chancel area to pray for our Pastor and the worship service. All are welcomed to join in this time together.

Alpha UMC switching to LED lighting!

Our Trustees have been working with Ameren Illinois to relamp our church building with LED lighting. Ameren is currently running an incentive program for businesses switching over to LED. The savings are pretty amazing!

Total cost to switch to LED:	\$2,907.65
Ameren will pay:	\$1,707.65
Alpha UMC will pay:	\$1,220.00

Estimated Annual Electric Dollars Saved: \$1,126.24



As you can see, with the incentive program and annual savings, this switch will save quite a bit on our monthly electric bill. Ameren estimates that the savings will cover our costs in about 13

The project will include switching out all fluorescent light fixtures with LED lighting, all 4 outdoor parking lot lights, and all EXIT signs. Ameren will supply all labor. Look for the switch to LED to take place sometime in April.




United Methodist Committee on Relief

Facing the inevitability of his death on the cross, Jesus chose to pray intensely for his own disciples before he was betrayed and arrested. Jesus prayed for them...and for us.

So what might Jesus' climactic prayer for his disciples in John 17 mean for us today?

Jesus prayed for us to know God and to have eternal life.

We must pray for others to know God and to have eternal life.

Jesus prayed for us to experience unity in our relationships.

We must pray for others to experience unity in their relationships.

Jesus prayed for our protection in His name from the evil one. We must pray in the name of Jesus for the protection of others from evil.

Jesus prayed for us to be filled with His joy, truth, and love. We must pray for God to fill others with Christ's joy, truth, and love.

Therefore, this Lent and Holy Week, I challenge us as a local church, to fervently pray for our neighbors and enemies like Jesus fervently prayed for his disciples and for us in John 17.

Heavenly Father, this is eternal life, that our neighbors and enemies may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. We ask you Father, on behalf of our neighbors and enemies who will believe in Jesus Christ through our gospel witness, that they may all be one. We ask you Father, in the name of your Son, Jesus, to protect our neighbors and enemies from the evil one. We ask you Father, that our neighbors and enemies may have Christ's joy made complete in themselves. Holy Spirit, sanctify our neighbors and enemies in the truth; your Word is truth...and sanctify us with your Word for their sakes. Lord Jesus, help us to make your love known to our neighbors and enemies, so that the Father's love with which you have loved each of us may be in them. Amen.

Jesus' invitation: 'Come!'

1/22/2018

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Matthew 11:28-30 NIV

Jesus invites us to walk with him on a wonder-filled adventure. The invitation is given to all who are saddled with weariness or bogged down with the pressures of day-to-day life. Looks like that includes just about everyone!

The invitation is to "come." We are challenged to be willing participants alongside others with Christ on this journey. The promise offered is rest. Rest from having to carry the weight of the world on our shoulders all by ourselves. Implicit in all of this is the promise that we will cease walking by ourselves, choosing our own direction and path. The encouragement to "come" is not a summons to do more work or to engage in a lifestyle of busyness. The promise of Christ is that in coming to him we would receive a special type of rest that prior to coming to him has been elusive.

As a boy growing up in a rural community I was familiar with a yoke. I was too young to have ever used a yoke, but heard plenty of stories from my father about how he had worked with oxen that were yoked together. The purpose of a yoke was to bind two animals together so that they could work together, in tandem, as a team.

I am pretty sure that being yoked with Christ is not because Christ expects me to do equal pulling. In fact, Christ dispels that notion right away by stating the goal of being yoked with him. He says, "take my yoke upon you and learn from me." The root word for learn is the same root that means to be a disciple. The invitation from Christ is not a call to do equal work, but is a plea for us to sojourn with him as student learners.

The older I get the more I realize how much I do not know. I do not know why the road of life has so many twists, turns, hills, terrain changes, hazards, pitfalls, chuckholes, and challenges. But I am confident that by being yoked with Christ I never face any of the potential perils alone. Our founder, John Wesley, allegedly said on his death bed, "Best of all God is with us!"

Emmanuel, "God with us," invites us to walk in harmony with him and with each other. Our guide and instructor is Jesus. He promises to be a gentle and humble leader that can direct us to places where our souls will find rest.

As we approach the Lenten Season we enter in to a period set aside for self-examination and spiritual assessment. As we look at our lives under the microscope of the Holy Spirit, we are once again invited by Christ to lay down our burdens and receive from him a yoke that is easy and light.

The burdens of life are not removed simply because we choose to walk with Jesus. Our burdens are lightened because Christ has the ability and the willingness to shoulder the load. Our task is to walk with Jesus and to LEARN how he deals with the stuff that we encounter on the journey. Jesus can teach us how to forgive, how to deal with the complexities of our changing world, and how to model his character and nature to folks wanting to see if the Christian lifestyle is real and authentic.

One of my recurring prayers is this, "Lord, your words say that the steps of the righteous are ordered of the Lord. Help me to not lag behind nor to run ahead. Help me to faithfully walk each day yoked with you, learning as we journey together."

Jesus knows "the way forward" and Jesus knows how to grant rest from the cares and the labors to each one that responds to the invitation to come and follow. God Bless, Bishop Beard
