Greetings friends!

I hope you are all safe and dry. April showers brought us more than May flowers this year...for many it brought flash floods. It looks like 1993 on the news! I've heard that many of our neighbors in town and out in the country have had water issues from heavy rains, swollen creeks, and crested rivers and some have flooded roads that are now closed. We had a sump pump malfunction and drain back up that resulted in a couple inches of water in our basement earlier this week. Special thanks to our rapid response trustees Dave Lambin and Dean Kernan for repairs and pumping the water out.

Last Sunday, I preached the conclusion of our Gospel of Matthew sermon series we began last December. It was based on Matthew 28:16-20 and focused on the Great Commission titled, "You are authorized to make disciples!" Then the Holy Spirit visited us in a powerful unplanned way at the last moment of our worship. I will never forget it and I am not the same now. I felt the spark of revival.

Now, this May we are exploring the Great Commission in-depth beyond Matthew 28:18-20. Why is this relevant for our church? First, the Great Commission seems to have fallen off of the radar of most people in America. Barna's research last year indicated:

"When asked if they had previously "heard of the Great Commission," half of U.S. churchgoers (51%) say they do not know this term. It would be reassuring to assume that the other half who know the term are also actually familiar with the passage known by this name, but that proportion is low (17%). Meanwhile, "the Great Commission" does ring a bell for one in four (25%), though they can't remember what it is. Six percent of churchgoers are simply not sure whether they have heard this term "the Great Commission" before."

My hope and prayer is that by the end of this month we as a church will all know and understand the Great Commission's meaning by heart (not just 17% of us). I know that this empowering command of Christ will impact your life.

Second, the United Methodist Church's mission statement is "Making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." I deduce that many churches have gradually declined in the past five decades because they have emphasized the latter and neglected the former. Wisdom is teaching me that the intentional choice to make disciples is the narrow less traveled path, while the temptation to transform the world through our own power is like the wide well-worn road that Jesus warned us to avoid. In other words, our main job is to make disciples of Jesus Christ while praying for a transformed world. Yet, a transformed world is only a vision lighting the end of the tunnel, but you and I obediently making disciples is the only vehicle to get there.

Third, I also think some churches have declined because disciple-making has been effectively relegated to the clergy and bible-teachers in classrooms. The people in the pews or at home outside the church haven't been properly equipped how to make disciples. Told to do so maybe. But taught how in practical and experiential ways like Jesus taught his disciples? Not so much. So as your pastor I am called by God to *"to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for build-ing up the body of Christ"* as Paul writes sin Ephesians 4:12. We will be engaging in a conversation of how we can make disciples and what that step-by-step process looks like in our lives today. I want you to become confident that "YES, I can make disciples of Jesus Christ."

So I'll see you in worship. I believe in you and I know that with the power of the Holy Spirit, you can and will "make disciples of all nations"

Christ transforms our lives so our community can thrive!

A Letter From Bishop Beard

Where are we headed? 4/18/2019



The United Methodist Church, according to some, is a denomination with a clouded future. The recently concluded 2019 General Conference did very little to ease the tension and anxiety within our family. Folks on all sides of the theological spectrum are wondering what the future holds for the people called "United Methodist." One thing is certain, we are clearly *not united* around issues of ministry as it relates to our LGBTQIA sisters and brothers.

I have heard frustrated laity and clergy, from across the denomination say, "*this is not the church I signed up for*." Angst and frustration abound. Well-meaning Christians continue to, like conjoined twins in a fist fight, hurt our own body. Where are we headed?

God is NOT the author of confusion. At least that is what I have been told. Yet, I am aware that God will allow us to wander around in our own wilderness circles when we fail to follow the path that God lays out for us. God is never content with us calling the shots and asking God to bless our directives. God wants us to trust and obey the plans of God, walking in step with Jesus, the Lord of the Church, assisted by the directives and power of the Holy Spirit.

Our self-absorption and self-indulgence in the church is at an all-time high. We have lost Paul's admonition and advice given to the Philippian Christians, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant ..." (Philippians 2:5-7a). *Self-servant* leadership is not a reliable biblical model.

My simple prayer continues to be; "Lord, send the gentle wind of your Holy Spirit to blow upon the embers of our hearts and fan us into flames for Jesus once again."

The Holy Spirit was provided to teach us how to be like Jesus and to accomplish the work that Jesus commissioned. Jesus said that the Holy Spirit would guide us. We need the Holy Spirit to guide us.

I believe, like our founders, Charles, John, and Susanna Wesley, that it is time to ask God for a fresh outpouring of the Spirit. Both John and Charles had a period of time when they knew that something spiritually was missing in their lives and ministries. Each of these men received a "second blessing" from God that enabled them to become victorious champions for the cause of Christ. We too can experience personal and corporate transformation if we are willing to humble ourselves and admit that we cannot get out of our current mess without the Holy Spirit. We need the fresh touch from heaven that comes when the Holy Spirit finds open and welcoming hearts.

If we want the fighting to end and peace to come within The United Methodist Church, each one of us will need to offer ourselves to Christ once again in full and total surrender. Each of us will need to seek spiritual renewal and empowerment that comes when the Holy Spirit is welcomed, and Jesus is allowed to be Lord.

Where are we headed? It all depends upon our willingness to give up control so that the Holy Spirit can bring the wind of renewal and restoration.

II Chronicles 7:14 reminds us of the place to start, "*If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.*"
