Greetings friends!

I've learned that sometimes in life, God will teach us wisdom through nature. On early Tuesday morning (August 20th) our Bradford Pear tree at the church was snapped in half through its trunk. As I looked closer at the freshly exposed heart of the tree, I was perplexed by an asymmetry of rival limbs protruding from its trunk. I had not noticed this before from my usual street view, but only upon closer examination after the storm ripped it apart. Previously, from the sidewalk I had always admired the tree's outward appearance of symmetry and beauty. Meanwhile, it had concealed a divided heart.

The next day, a chainsaw party commenced with Dave Lambin, Kenny Lambin, Richard Coffey, and Dale Lanning to cut down and haul off the limbs and branches of the damaged tree. A special thank you to everyone who



promptly worked to remove the tree before it fell down or caused other damage! During the tree clean up, Desirae Silvis mentioned to me, "a tree is only supposed to have one leader." Those words stopped me in my tracks. "<u>A tree is only supposed to have ONE leader.</u>" I received her words as wisdom from God. I learned that if a tree has more than one leader it is more likely to be damaged in storms or snap like ours did recently. So in hindsight, this tree was already fragile and susceptible to storm damage because it had *codominant leaders* instead of one leader guiding its growth. However, it might have withstood more storms had it been more carefully pruned during its earlier growth. I read online that afternoon of arborists warning us of the dangers of trees with codominant leaders:

"What are codominant leaders? What risk do they cause? What can we do to prevent or control them? A codominant leader is when a tree has more than one main trunk that is similar in diameter. **The problem with codominant leaders is that the union between the multiple leads has "bark inclusion" which causes the structure of the tree to be very weak.** <u>Trees that are structurally weak have a high risk of</u> <u>failing and causing damage to anything around them.</u> <u>A tree with</u> <u>one main leader or trunk and smaller branches stemming from it is</u> <u>a preferred and generally stronger structure</u>. There are a few things

we can do to prevent or help correct codominant leaders, the first be-

ing proper tree selection. When you hire a certified arborist, the tree selected will be structurally sound with one dominant trunk.

Certain tree species are well known for developing several competing branches and can be severely damaged in storms such as **Bradford Pears** and Red Maples. If you have a tree that is already in your yard with this problem, we can address it early in the tree's life with "subordination pruning". When we prune this way, we select the lead that we would like to reduce and prune only from that stem. By doing this consistently over a few years, we are allowing our selected dominant lead to develop more growth while training the less stable lead to remain smaller. If a tree is already mature, it may be too late to begin subordination pruning, but there is still another option to create more strength within the structure of the tree..."

In life, we too can demonstrate a normal or even a healthy well-rounded outward appearance to others from a distance. Nonetheless, upon closer examination of ourselves, are we hiding structural imbalances or competing priorities that carry much weight in our lives but leave us vulnerable to an unforeseen crisis or storm that will expose our divided hearts or cause us to break under pressure like our Bradford Pear tree? I don't know about you, but I have lived like that before. It almost destroyed me. Thank God for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! May God's Word will encourage you:

Matthew 6:24 "<u>No one can serve two masters</u>. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.

John 15:1 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. 2 He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes[a] so that it will be even more fruitful. 3 You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. 4 Remain in me, as I also remain in you. <u>No branch can bear</u> fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. 5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. 6 If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.

Jesus warns us of codominant leaders and calls us to follow Him as the ONE Leader so that we will grow and thrive in God's love. May God prune any competing or codominant limbs or branches in your life so that you can abide in Christ and bear much fruit for God. Remember: <u>"A tree is only supposed to have ONE leader."</u>

Christ transforms our lives so that our community can thrive.
